Long-serving Winton community volunteer Peter King has been honoured for many years of service to his community.

Mr King received a Community Service Award from the Oreti Community Board and Southland District Council at a ceremony at Winton's Middle Pub on Friday 10 June. Southland District Mayor Gary Tong made the presentation to Mr King, with flowers for his wife Laureen, at a ceremony led by Oreti Community Board deputy chair Peter Schmidt.

Mr King has been a member of Winton Rotary for around 40 years and has played a leading role in many Rotary projects in the area.

One outstanding project was the Winton Trail. Since its completion around seven years ago, Mr King took on the responsibility of weed spraying the entire circuit. His normal routine was to walk the track early in the day to find spots that needed attention, then pick a calm period to do the spraying. His efforts kept the trail in great condition to be enjoyed by thousands of walkers and cyclists.

Mr King has also voluntarily contributed much to planting and pruning, particularly at Moores Reserve, where he has nurtured hundreds of native trees and shrubs for the benefit of the public and Winton's beautification.

At a sprightly 87 years old, Mr King has recently retired from carrying the heavy sprayer around the trail but remains available for light voluntary work.

Winton Wasterwater **Treatment Proposed Upgrade**

The Winton wastewater treatment plant will require a new consent in 2023.

Currently, the wastewater plant disposes of treated wastewater to the Winton Stream. However, due to environmental, cultural and regulatory factors it is highly unlikely that this scheme will be allowed to continue when consent for the plant expires in 2023.

Southland District Council is exploring options for the proposed upgrade of the wastewater system.

Council staff will be hosting a community drop-in session to be held on Monday 25 July.

The drop-in session is open from 2pm to 6pm at the Winton Memorial Hall Supper Room. Pop in and review the options being considered for Winton and future planning for Centre Bush, Limehills and Browns.
