Early on I thought I needed to delete our "traditional solid mince pie" as a North island visitor purchased one, said it was the worst pie he had ever eaten and if that was the type of pie we served in our Bakery he would be telling everyone not to come in!

It wasn't long before a petition was going around to bring it back. Of course I did, and it now happily sits in the pie cabinet alongside a "runny mince pie" and more modern flavours like butter chicken and seafood.

Working through a worldwide pandemic is not something anyone expected in their By Jeannie Peebles lifetime and I was so proud of how my talented team managed, learning about social distancing, then contact tracing, and keeping things running as normally as we could.

Country Manor Catering will still continue to trade strongly from the rear of the Bakery building.

Maintenance Job Position


CENTRAL SOUTHLAND COMMUNITY SWIMMING POOL

The position would suit a local person who is physically active and able and currently working part-time or semi-retired.

The position involves the maintaining of the two swimming pools and associated heating and filtration equipment. There is regular water quality testing and the handling of chemicals, i.e., chlorine. Training would be provided. This position does require some heavy lifting, up to 25 kilograms.

Hours average around one to three per day but varies depending on tasks required. 

SESSION 1: 9 AM TO 10 AM

The day kicks off from 9-10 with a 1-hour parent focused session, where Emma will discuss the basics and benefits of a Structured Literacy approach. This session is strongly recommended for parents of children attending a structured literacy school, as well as parents with a child who may be struggling with learning to read and spell.
