

ANZ to keep Winton netballers on the court with fee subsidy



With many families feeling financial pressure, ANZ Netball Grants aims to ensure kids can play netball by subsidising Winton kids' registration fees. ANZ is providing \$100,000 in netball fee subsidies to ensure Kiwi kids can play the game they love. This financial help could be the difference between a child getting into the game or having to watch the season from the side-lines.

Teams can apply directly for financial support from ANZcourtside.co.nz until entries close 24 March 2023.

ANZ has supported netball, from grassroots teams in the community to the elite players in the ANZ Premiership and Silver Ferns, for 14 years.

ANZ Bank New Zealand Chief Executive Antonia Watson says more and more families are under financial pressure and registration fees are one of the first barriers of entry to sport.

"Sport is such an important part of a child's wellbeing and we don't want families who might be doing it tough to miss out. "Nothing brings Kiwi families together like weekend sport and, particularly at times of stress, it's a great way to strengthen community spirit. "We hope this support helps remove that financial barrier and allows everyone to continue to enjoy netball


Southern REAP Census Support for Census Day 7 March 2023

Drive My Life



Southern REAP is proud to deliver a Community Mentoring Driving Programme called Drive My Life (DML) for vulnerable members of the Southland and Whakatipu region. The programme is a referral-based programme for those wanting to gain the necessary knowledge and skills essential to obtain a driver's licence. Overall, this helps the community with developing smarter and safer drivers on our roads.

Holding a licence can lead to gaining employment, better education opportunities, access to goods and services and a sense of independence as well as the ability to connect with family and friends. Drive My Life in Winton is seeking volunteers to be new mentor buddies helping vulnerable people achieve their restricted and or full drivers licence. As a volunteer driving mentor you are the supervisor enabling the learner to get out on the road and work on their skills to be test ready.

Mentors are paired with the same learner until they successfully pass their driving test. You get to watch them increase their skills and gain confidence and proficiency. The role is not so much technical, but more their support buddy, someone who listens, is focused and full of encouragement.

Does this sound interesting?? Are you able to donate at least 1 hour per week, keen to give back to the community by helping change a person's life and assist them to achieve a life changing goal? If you are over 25 years of age, have held a current Full NZ drivers licence for more than 2 years and are be able to pass a Police vet then you could qualify.

Residential rates

rises of 6% to 13% proposed in draft Annual Plan

Southland District Council is budgeting on residential rates rises ranging from 6% to 13% in its draft Annual Plan for 2023/2024. The analysis is based on budget and rating information as at 4 February 2023 and may change before Council adopts the final 2023/2024 Annual Plan in June 2023.

Staff will present a report on the progress of the 2023/2024 Annual Plan process to the Finance and Assurance Committee on 15 February 2023.

The proposed rates changes will affect townships throughout the district differently depending on a range of factors, including the services provided in respective areas.

By township the proposed average rate increase varies from \$110, or 6%, in Orepuki, to \$337 or 13%, in Riversdale. The highest dollar increase is in Manapouri at \$400, or 11%.

By land use sector the proposed average rate increase varies from \$76, or 1.83%, for forestry, to \$886, or 10.63%, for commercial properties.

The increase for residential properties is primarily being driven by higher interest costs for water and sewerage loans, increased cost of waste services and removing \$1 million of reserve subsidies used in previous years to reduce sewerage rates. Because sewerage, water and rubbish are mainly provided in townships, these cost increases are impacting residential households the most. Overall total rates are budgeted to increase by \$4.6 million, or 7.84%, over the previous year. This compares with 5.75% projected for year three in Council's 2021-2031 Long Term Plan (LTP). The key increases contributing include \$1.3 million from higher interest costs on loans to complete capital works projects, \$1million is because wastewater is no longer being subsidised by reserve funding and \$800,000 is caused by an increase in overall waste costs

While the increase is above what was projected, given that it is due to a mix of inflationary costs as well as a planned move away from using reserves to reduce rates, it is proposed that Council does not undertake formal consultation and instead engage with and seek feedback from the community about the reasons for the increases.


