WINTON'S HERITAGE TOUR, BY HERITAGE SOUTH



As part of Heritage South's month of heritage events, Sarah Gallagher and Susie Farminer from Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga's Otago Southland office led a tour of a number of buildings that make up the Great North Road Historic Area which features on Rārangi K1ōrero/The New Zealand Heritage List. Winton may be the oldest European

inland town in Southland. Set amidst rich agricultural country it was a stopping point on route to the gold rush and is believed to be named after Thomas Winton, a stockman who helped surveyor Clement Johnstone with two surveys of the area in 1862 and 1863.

Winton developed from a staging post with hotels providing food, drink, a bed and stabling for horses, and supply stores like Liddell's, to a fully serviced town with a local authority in 1875. An article in the early 1900s described Winton as having "three or four churches, several public halls, hotels, a branch of the Bank of New Zealand, several large stores, a flourishing flour mill, and a meat and rabbit-preserving establishment. The local industries include sawmilling, townscape value, their architectural style, and their contribution to the s well-appointed modern dairy factory." It history of Winton. Four significant was known as a centre for farming, sawmilling and coal mining. During Sawmilling and coal mining.

WWII Winton also became a centre for linen flax production.

Winton's building stock was ravaged by fire on two main occasions in 1901 and 1921, following the later a bylaw was passed to declare all future buildings be constructed of brick. Within the historic area are twenty one heritage places. These places are included in the Historic listing because of their

style, and their contribution to the social It history of Winton. Four significant New Zealand architects are represented in Winton's architecture: ER Wilson (BNZ and the ANZAC memorial gates), CJ Brodrick (Central Southland Lodge and Invercargill Savings Bank), EH Smith (Bank of New South Wales) and FW Burwell (Anglican Church) and a variety of architectural styles can be viewed from colonial through neoclassical, art deco and modern styles. The tour was well attended by an interested and engaged group of locals. As the road works were in place the tour took place from the pleasant surroundings of the ANZAC oval and was supplemented by visits to the Anglican Church. The former Invercargill Savings Bank building and culminated at the middle pub where an excellent discussion ensued.
