

The year is flying by, the mornings are starting to get a little darker, and it's feeling a lot like autumn. This is my favourite time of year as it means we are heading towards the ROAR and duck shooting, but it tends to lead to a lot of issues for landowners with unlawful hunting.

If you are heading out for a pre-Roar trip there are a few things you need to think of:

- Check the expiry date on your firearms license if it expires in the next six months please reapply before it expires.
- Make sure you are up to speed with the new firearms transportation rules as we will be stopping and checking compliance this year.
- Make sure you have permission to hunt on private property or are permitted if on a forestry or DOC land. Failure to do so will see a review of your suitability to hold a firearms license or even a trip to court for unlawful hunting.
- Remember the seven firearms safety rules the most important being to identify your target, it's too late once you pull that trigger.

If you are a landowner having poaching issues contact us at the station and we can assist with advice, signage, and deterrence patrols.

Our second big issue over the autumn months is motorists not driving to the road conditions. We get dry periods on our roads but then showers and this makes the roads greasy, so watch your speed and watch out for the slick patches of tar when they are wet. Police also increase the alcohol enforcement on our roads leading up to the winter sports season so please don't drink and drive.

The troops have asked me to mention the local Facebook pages as they are seeing lots of comments from locals about thefts or suspicious activity, but nothing is coming to us. A recent post I saw was about tools stolen from a ute and nearly 20 people commented about what they had seen but not one person had called the Police.

One of the comments was "what are the Police doing about it" ... the answer is nothing as we weren't aware it was happening.

We are pretty good at catching criminals - been doing it for 28 years - but it starts with the community telling us what is happening.

I get Facebook is easy and you can have your say but commenting on Facebook is not reporting it to Police and I am yet to see Facebook arrest an offender and put them to court.

If you see someone posting about a crime, comment back and tell them if it's happening now dial 111 or, if it's not urgent, call the Police line number 105.

Oreti Community Board report back on Winton CCTV cameras

In August last year the board requested that the chief executive of Southland District Council provide the board with the necessary information to be able to make an informed decision on the proposed CCTV cameras in Winton township.

A working group with representatives from Council staff and board members was formed in collaboration with the Southern Police District to work through the points of concern, which were all addressed in a comprehensive report that Council staff presented to the board on 17 February.

The working group has made good progress, and questions around privacy matters were addressed including updating existing Council policies and formulating a new 'agreement' between Southland District Council and Southern Police District, which in turn has prompted both parties to consider the implementation of these updated measures throughout the wider Southern region.

On 17 February Council staff also provided the board with an independent and comprehensive cost estimate of \$130,000 plus GST for the installation of five CCTV cameras along Great North Road and one on John Street. Included in this figure are all-of-life cost aspects such as new poles, power supply, signage etc.

Additional to the above figure, and previously not factored in, is the cost for maintenance, which Council staff estimated to be \$5,000 each year. The Winton community should be aware that as per industry estimate, the average lifespan of CCTV systems is between five and 10 years.

As these costs are substantially higher than the \$16,000 and \$44,000 Council staff presented to the board in June last year and to what was circulating in the public arena, the board has suggested that the working group continue with

a new focus on narrowing down the actual work scope to enable the board to identify possible cost savings for discussion when the board meets next on 24 March.
