

New Central Southland Hub established

Eighteen months after the first meeting of interested parties, a new sports hub has officially been established in Winton. The Central Southland Hub Incorporated's mission is: "An innovative, sustainable hub that encourages and inspires our community to connect through sport and recreational opportunities."

Active Southland initially brought together a group of interested community members to explore the idea of creating a local sports hub. Since then, a committed group has met regularly, developed a constitution, crafted a mission statement, and appointed four independent Board Members: Colin Smith, Sarah Illsley, Warren Bryant, and Sophie Erwood.

On 1 April 2025, the inaugural AGM of Central Southland Hub Incorporated was held. At this meeting, three additional Board Members were elected by the founding hub members — Winton Cricket Club Inc, Winton Football Club Inc, Midlands Rugby, Central Rugby League Inc, Central Southland Swimming, and Central Southland College. The newly elected Board Members are Aaron McDowell, Tere Webb, and Grant Campbell. They are joined by two student representatives from Central Southland College, Jorja Marshall and Jamie Yall. The Hub is proud to also partner with Touch Southland, Southland District Council, and Active Southland.

While the Hub's initial focus is on supporting its founding members, it is eager to expand and welcomes other clubs or recreational groups interested in joining. If your club or organisation would like to find out more, please contact one of the Board Members — they would be happy to visit and speak with your group.

A key topic raised at the AGM was the recent changes to the Incorporated Societies Act. To support the wider community, the Hub has arranged for Denise Lormans from Community Law to host an information session in Winton. All clubs and organisations in Central Southland that are incorporated societies — or are considering becoming one — are invited to attend.

Winton engineering firm helps historic locomotive find new life in Lumsden

A piece of New Zealand's railway history has come back to life, thanks in part to expert craftsmanship right here in Winton.

On Tuesday, April 15, an 1880s steam locomotive, D6, was dramatically craned into its new home at the Lumsden Railway Precinct, completing a 12-year heritage project by the Lumsden Heritage Trust. The locomotive, which had sat in storage for nearly 60 years, was lovingly refurbished over the past three years by Winton's own Bulleid Engineering.

The operation was a true community effort involving local businesses, including Bulleid Engineering, Smith Crane & Construction, Southland Machine Hire, and the Titter family. To make way for D6, a 1948 diesel engine was lifted and repositioned, with part of the shed roof removed and reassembled in a single day.

D6 now leads a unique display of pre-1900 carriages and rolling stock in Lumsden. Built in Glasgow in 1880 and retired from service in 1917, the locomotive has deep roots in Southland rail history.

The Lumsden Heritage Trust's efforts have earned national recognition, including multiple awards for restoration and innovation.


