

### Winton firefighters reach new heights at the Firefighter Sky Tower Challenge

Eight members of the Winton brigade have spent the last few months training to participate in the Firefighter Sky Tower Challenge. The physical aspect of the challenge is to climb from the Auckland Sky Tower from the basement to the viewing platform, a total of 1103 stairs, 51 flights and 328 vertical metres. In addition to this they were wearing full firefighting kit including breathing apparatus weighing a total of 25kg.

The goal of the Firefighter Sky Tower Challenge is not only to make it to the Sky Tower viewing platform, but to raise funds for Leukaemia and Blood Cancer New Zealand. The idea is that although walking the height of the Sky Tower in full firefighting kit is very challenging, this is nothing compared to what those dealing with cancer have to face each and every day. Over the last few months you no doubt have seen our team members sitting outside Winton New World selling firewood raffle tickets and accepting donations.

A few weeks ago we also hosted a Winton Businesses quiz night at our fire station. With the outstanding support of our Central Southland community our brigade raised just over \$14000 out of a national total that currently stands at \$1.9 million. We are exceptionally proud that not only do we roll the fire trucks out when the community needs us, but we also give back when the opportunity arises.

Although fundraising is the main focus, we always get asked how the climb went. Opinions from our team members always vary from 'bloody hard' to 'bloody brilliant' and everything in between, including expletives describing the difficulty and questioning our sanity. We are thrilled to share that in the teams event (top three combined times from each brigade) we placed 7th out of 95 teams, with only one team ahead of us being a volunteer station.

Finally, many thanks to all the people, both individuals and businesses that continue to support the Winton Volunteer Fire Brigade Sky Tower team. We couldn't do this without you and we look forward to getting stuck in again for the 2026 Firefighter Sky Tower Challenge.

This year's duck shooting opening saw Police staff out in the field with Fish and Game rangers checking firearms compliance across several ponds in the Central Southland area. I am pleased to report that no criminal offences were detected, and intoxication levels were low with most hunters heeding the call to put the guns away when the beers come out. There was one gun seized from an unlicensed hunter by Fish and Game and they will pursue this matter.

It's that time of year again when we wake up to everything covered in frost and whilst that normally means a clear day ahead it also means a frosted windscreen on the car. Every year we see the drivers who can't wait or be bothered defrosting the windscreen before they drive, and they are peering through a small hole they have scratched in the frost. We have all done it but it's dangerous and is an offence to drive with an obscured windscreen - a \$150 fine. They might not be able to see but they are very easy for the troops to pick up and stop, so if heading out please defrost the screen first. It's also a timely reminder to check lights and tyres as we prepare for winter driving conditions.

Still on a driving note we have been stopping a few local farmers using tractors towing large trailers to move bailage from farm to farm. Our issue is they are not tying the bailage on sufficiently - each bale must have a strop securing it. With bales weighing several hundred kilos they can do significant damage to a passing car and there is a rather hefty \$600 fine for insecure loading. As always, I would rather educate than enforce but our commercial vehicle team may take a firmer stance, so you have been warned.

You may have seen in the media about a protest drone shot down during duck shooting and we have had much debate about the legalities of such an act. Every year we get similar reports of activists flying drones checking cows grazing crop.

The law around flying drones is very clear, it cannot be done over private land or dwellings without the owner's consent and as such would be a breach of civil aviation law.

Any trespass or suspicious behaviour is a Police matter so please call us via 111 at the time rather than you take your own action that could get you into trouble.


