## History-making season for Winton Football

This year the senior men's team won the Southland Men's Premier League, lifting the Donald Gray Cup for the first time in the club's 43-year history.

Winton coach Cody Kinraid said the team had stepped up from winning Division 1 last year, and the chance to play against some of Southland's best players every week had elevated the whole team.

"At the start of the season we just wanted to be competitive, and then every week we just got stronger and stronger," he said.

"It was about half way through us coaches looked at each other and thought, we've got a real shot here.... I think a lot of that comes down to playing better teams every week."

"Playing the likes of Queens Park and Old Boys who have those players who are pushing for SPL (Southern Premier League) spots, forced us to lift every week. It's really good for football as a whole."

In bright signs for the future, the club also took home the Division 3 senior competition, and junior football is hitting record numbers within both competitive and social competitions.

About 40 teams are set to line up for summer league football starting this month.
