Toot for Tucker returns



What began as a simple idea in 2023 has quickly become one of Winton's favourite community traditions. Thanks to the kindness of so many people, the first two years of Toot for Tucker were a powerful display of local generosity.

On Tuesday 2 December at 7pm, the Winton Lions, emergency services, and close to 100 volunteers will take to the streets to collect non-perishable items for the Let's Link Winton Food Bank. Residents are encouraged to leave their donations out by 7pm and listen for sirens as the collection teams make their way through town.

Lions volunteer and St John paramedic Juon Schoen says: "It was just an idea in 2023, but thanks to so many kind, generous people our first years of Toot for Tucker were super successful. As emergency services it is an awesome way to connect with our community."

The Let's Link Foodbank is extremely grateful for the community's ongoing support, says Winton Community Worker Louise Faithful: "The Let's Link Winton Food Bank is so very grateful to the Winton community for their generosity in giving to our food bank. Toot for Tucker has been a game changer in stocking our food bank shelves in the last couple of years. Along with the New World Food For Families collection our shelves and storage cupboards will hopefully become stocked to last the year."

Winton Police update



What a month it has been! Southland has certainly felt the force of Mother Nature, with winds unlike anything many of us have experienced before.

It's remarkable that there was no loss of life, especially considering the close calls - people dodging falling trees and encountering downed powerlines. At one point, emergency services were managing over 1,800 reported incidents.

It was heartening to see our community come together, with neighbours checking in on each other and lending a hand where needed.

Unfortunately, we also saw the darker side of human behaviour, with generators stolen from critical infrastructure such as cell phone towers.

The widespread power and water outages were a timely reminder for all of us to maintain a basic emergency kit. The civil defence website provides guidance on what to include: https://getready.govt.nz/prepared/

Planning for the Alpine Fault (AF8)

Staying on the theme of preparedness, we've been reviewing plans for the overdue Alpine Fault rupture (AF8).

While modelling suggests Southland will fare better than other parts of the South Island, an earthquake exceeding magnitude 8 would still be devastating. 
Remember:




