A word from our Winton Police

A little tip for employers from Winton Police. Are you aware you can request a criminal record check on current or potential employees? To obtain a criminal record check (criminal conviction history) for someone else, you do need the other

person's signed agreement. To do this, you both must fill in different parts of the application form. These forms are found the Ministry of Justice website at: https://www.justice.govt.nz/criminal-records/get-someone-elses/ or we have the forms at Winton Station. Once a court appearance has been completed this is often public record so a simple google search can often tell you if a person has appeared in court and whether it's for something that could be a concern for you and your business.

If you see anything going on that doesn't seem right or the kids come home after playing somewhere & they tell you they have witnessed something concerning, give us a call straight away. We do want to know about it & the sooner we are advised the sooner we can have a chat to the people involved.




Donations of books required
